

Is your child sharing their concerns with you effectively?

Could my limited proficiency in Korean be why my child doesn't confide in me?



Many of you might have faced conflicts in daily life due to difficulties in having profound conversations with your children in Korean. Even within families that share the same language and culture, different generations naturally experience friction. The challenges can be even more significant in multicultural families where various languages and cultures intermingle. Children may avoid conversations due to language barriers. Sometimes, parents who are less proficient in Korean than their children may feel marginalized, leading to a need for a bilingual environment at home.

What is Bilingualism?

It refers to an individual's ability to speak two languages and is also an advantage for children in multicultural families.

Parents proficient in Korean play the role of communicators!



Parents who can smoothly communicate in Korean should play a key role in understanding and conveying the child's feelings. Also, to prevent a spouse struggling with Korean from feeling left out, consider learning simple greetings from the spouse's native language. While the primary language at home can be Korean, fostering a bilingual atmosphere is beneficial.
